Caslon Primary School Gardening Club, kids planting out the blanch leeks in the tunnel on their plot



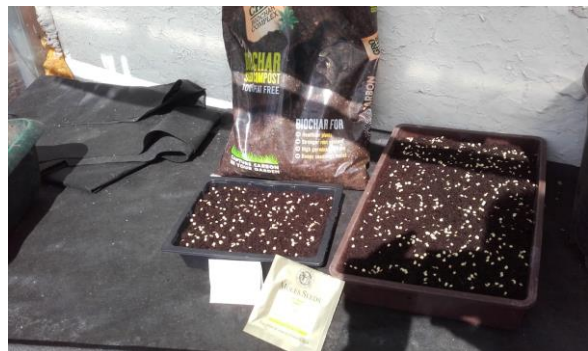
A good watering with rain water caught by the sheds on site



Straw is now top dressed to keep in the moisture and warmth

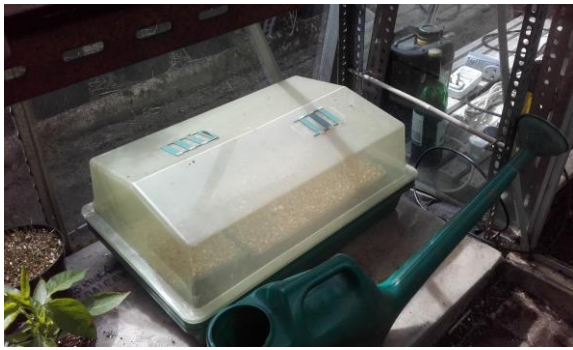


Got in touch with Moles Seeds and told them I wanted to get kids involved at BB Gardener's World Live, being a superior seed company they sent me packets of seed!





I want to get kids pricking out their own seedlings and then potting it on, they can then take it home with the NVS sticker on the side! The kids have toms and peppers to pick from. Have enough seed for a few years, cheers Moles Seeds



Even the plots alongside the people with learning difficulties now have raised beds



Bung a lid on it, simples



Four rows firm'd in, mycorrhizae in each hole



I was the 1st to have raised beds on our allotment site, since then people have seen the difference between my produce and theirs, now 3/4 of our site have 'em!

A good watering with liquid hoss muck, still may get a frost so straw is going on, as well as keeping in the warmth this will also keep in the moisture, plus keeping the weeds down!
