We decided to donate this to our new plot holders with learning difficulties, and their organiser asked me to give them ideas on what to buy. I did better than that, I got it all...and here it is!



The last of my chillis is going out in the tunnel on the plot as the large onions are out which gives me space for a lemon drop chilli to go in. A dollop of mycorrhizal fungi underneath first

The trimmings from the side of the path up the back garden are thrown onto the lawn, then when I cut the grass this is chopped up and mixed with the grass cuttings - an excellent addition to the compost heap when mixed with other ingredients



Last sowing of 6 show peas in the tunnel

The spare peas are going outside and the wire rings that were used for my onions are now protecting the peas from the dreaded badger!

A top dressing of Biochar fertiliser is used - this has an N-P-K. of 5-5-5. The make up being biochar, mycorrhizal fungi, seaweed, worm casts plus a nutrient blend
