

Getting greenhouse ready for...now! Toms up out of greenhouse as I need it to start off again. Another good advert for mycorrhizal fungi, roots of my toms over 6ft long

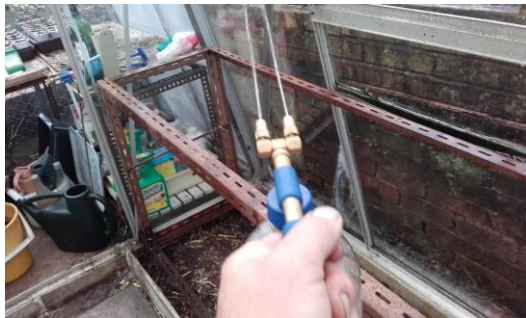


Straw collected and soil watered

Greenhouse sterilised with Jeyes fluid inside and out



Flit sprayer, ideal for washing down the glass after sterilising



Greenhouse shut tight and candle lit, left for 6 hours



Greenhouse ventilated with top shelves replaced (these were scrubbed down with Jeyes before being stowed away). Capillary matting put back onto shelves



I also use these to get rid of any little chaps that I've missed





My top dressing's ready to be hand forked in the beds...hoss muck (manure) nuggets, worm casts, basalt rock dust and garden compost



Right hand side bed has been top dressed, left hand side hand forked in, once done the beds are watered well



After a good watering, a weed suppressant (from Wilko) is put down. Don't forget the manure and my compost is full of worms. These will now do my digging, that's why they were invented

Staging put back on the bottom shelves. The frame work for my staging is angle iron and has been up for 30 years!



Another lot of shallots to pickle, peeled

Soaked overnight in salt water, then swilled and dried, vinegar, sugar and black pepper corms warmed up then added to jar of shallots, grease proof paper, a lid and sealed



Another lot ready for our show next year (plus chillies), these will have their hats put on before the show!
