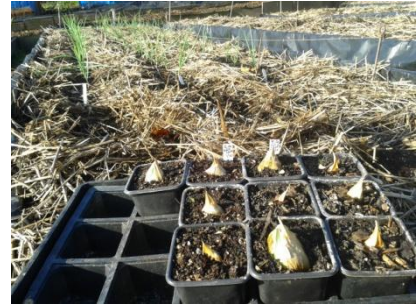


Garlic ready to go out. Their roots tell me they are ready!
