## RECIPES

Please adhere to tin sizes and quantities where stated.

### 67 Cherry cake

100g butter or margarine, 100g sugar, 2 eggs, few drops vanilla essence, 175g plain flour, 1 level tsp baking powder, 100g glacé cherries, 1 ½ tbs milk. 6"/15cm cake tin.

Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas 4. Mix butter and sugar until soft, add eggs one at a time and beat, add vanilla essence and fold in flour. Add cherries and mix. Put in lightly greased tin. Bake for one hour or until cake has shrunk away from the sides of tin and feels firm to touch.

### 68 Coconut cake

170g (6oz) butter or margarine, 230g (8oz) sugar, 230g (8oz) flour, 1 tsp baking powder, 2 eggs, 1/2 tsp salt, 115g (4oz) desiccated coconut, a little milk.

Pre-heat oven to 160°C/Gas 3. Cream butter and sugar. Add each egg separately, beating well between each addition. Sift salt, baking powder and flour together and fold into creamed mixture. Add coconut. Add a little milk to soften the consistency. Bake in lightly greased 7" tin for approximately 1 ½ hours.

### 70/71 Chocolate Victoria sponge

170g (6oz) butter or margarine, 170g (6oz) sugar, 3 eggs, 140g (5oz) SR flour, 30g (1oz) cocoa powder, or drinking chocolate.

Pre-heat oven to 180°C/Gas 4. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time. Beat mixture. Sift flour and cocoa powder and fold into mixture. Divide between two 7" sandwich tins. Bake for 20-25 minutes. Allow to cool, then sandwich together with filling of your own choice.
